**Calling on all parents and guardians to assist KES staff in making sure that the Japanese Erasers and Silly Bandz** (also known as Animal Bandz, Zany Bandz Stretchy Shapes, Bama Bandz, Goofy Bands and there are a few others names that escape me right now) do not come to school each day with the children.

This latest craze among our student population is beginning to cause some inappropriate behaviors and lack of attention in our classrooms and other areas. These small, cute, novelty erasers, which actually come apart and are used for erasing are a new craze for kids to collect and I might add...they LOVE them! Yes, kids are collecting them all over the country and they have arrived in Kingston!

The Silly Bandz is also a collection item and as I understand the goal is to collect as many bracelets as you can, wear as many as you can, and then trade them with your friends. They come in all different shapes such as animals, food, toys which makes them very appealing to young children. Both the Japanese Erasers and Silly Bandz items are environmentally friendly, lead free, recyclable and are Made in Japan. This makes them even more appealing to everyone. However, as cute as they are and as environmentally safe as the companies who make them claim those to be...they are causing a disturbance in our classrooms each day.

Students are turning away from listening and learning in order to look at their friend's collection, take the eraser or bracelet indefinitely, and we have even had some students grabbing them away from other students

Iwako and Dream Erasers are two of the Japanese companies who are making these products. Imposter companies have sprung up as well on this latest craze. Although the subtleties are there, one of the imposter companies is in China. From what I have read about these products and companies who make them, there are real differences. The Japanese companies of **Iwako and Dream Erasers** have created an environmentally friendly product and stamp Made in Japan. One of the imposter company's is stamping Made in China and stamps in the name of the company **Imako**. So, there may be a difference in the product you are buying for your child. The company in China (Imako) may not be as environmentally safe, or may not be lead free or recyclable as you might think. An informed consumer is a wise consumer. If you go onto the Internet and read up on these products it may help you to make a more informed decision.
